IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF ALEXANDER THE GREAT

Marmaris – The sailing center of Turkey. A fun and vibrant place that has retained its natural charm despite being a magnet for tourists. Served by Dalaman airport, which is an hour's drive away.

Caunos – Near Dalyan a series of elaborate Lycian rock tombs can be seen cut into the faces of distant cliffs. The extensive ruins include a huge Roman bath, Persian city walls, A Carian fortress, a Greek theater and a Byzantine basilica.

Göcek – Set at the north-west end of the Gulf of Fethiye, Göcek is blessed with magnificent scenery. Backed by majestic mountains and substantial pine forests it looks out over the Twelve Islands, which provide shelter for an almost circular bay that has made the village such a perfect, natural, harbour. Lured by such perfection, the yachting community has long made Göcek a favourite, and it is also a popular stop for Gullet cruises.

Fethiye – The Gulf of Fethiye is made up of beautiful beaches, crystal clear water and an atmosphere of complete relaxation that is the hallmark of this idyllic stretch of the southern coast of Turkey.

Xanthos – The capital of the Lycian federation and its greatest city for most of Lycian history. Finds date back to the 8th century BC.



Patara – A wide variety of ancient monuments include the Theater, Tomb of the Harpies, Naried Monument, agora and inscribed pillar date from Lycian, Roman and Byzantine times.

Kalkan – an old fishing town that is full of character famous for its white-washed houses, descending to the sea, and for its brightly coloured bouganvilleas.

Kekova – The submerged ruins of a port dating back to the 5th century BC can be seen beneath your boat.

Simena – A medieval castle sits atop the hill surrounded by the ruins of ancient Simena, giving magnificent views over the huge expanse of turquoise water.

Myrna – Featuring both Lycian and Roman ruins, including rock tombs cut out of the cliff face and a spectacular amphitheater. The Church of St. Nicolas dates back to the 6th century.

Phaselis – Rich in Archeological interest, dating back to 700 BC. It was the most important harbour of ancient Lycia, being a center of commerce between Greece, Asia, Egypt and Phoenicia.

Aspendos – A city of great wealth derived from trade in salt, oil and wool. Renowned for the best preserved theater in antiquity still used today as host to the Aspendos International Opera and Ballet Festival.

Side – The ancient maritime city of Pamphylia has extensive ruins that are Renowned as the finest in Asia Minor.
